Thank you for your request for information received on 9 January 2022 which was dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Northern Ireland Ambulance Service (NIAS) Health and Social Care Trust has now completed its search for the information you requested and that is detailed below.

Question 1

I'm wondering when the next intake for the EMT training program will be for 2022 and I would be really interested to join when this becomes available.

Answer 1

The next intake for EMT training, for which a recruitment exercise will be undertaken, is anticipated to be in November 2022. However, this is not yet confirmed.

I hope this fully assists you. If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. You should do this as soon as possible, or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter.

If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you remain dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request, you may make a complaint under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the Trust has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act.
