For the cohort of the population who phoned 999 how many of these are classified as risk of death or in need of an emergency ambulance?	
Similarly, for each of these patients, what is the average time from their call being logged until the hospital handover time?	
How many patients have been transferred as emergency or routine cases in this scenario
