Thank you for your request for information received on 5<sup>th</sup> July which was dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Northern Ireland Ambulance Service (NIAS) Health and Social Care Trust has now completed its search for the information you requested and that is detailed below.

FOI QUESTION(S)	ANSWER(S)
1) How many applications were submitted for the post?	50 applicants for post.
2) How many interviews were completed for the post?	25 applicants shortlisted for interview by panel.
3) How many applicants passed the interview process and were placed on a waiting list.	12 applicants passed interview and were placed on waiting list
4) How many posts were filled immediately / to date?	6 posts
5) From the positions filled, how many were from the recruitment process & how many from medical redeployment?	Fewer than 5 posts from the waiting list and fewer than 5 posts via medical redeployment.  <i>For confidentiality purposes, where numbers are fewer than five, specific details cannot be disclosed.</i>
6) From those medically redeployed, how many applied for the post through the recruitment campaign?	None
7) Do the successful applicants for this role avail of a service vehicle.	Community Resuscitation staff may avail of a service vehicle during operational shift hours. Outside of these hours, the vehicle remains at the designated NIAS location.
