Thank you for your request for information received on 11 September 2023 which was dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Northern Ireland Ambulance Service (NIAS) Health and Social Care Trust has now completed its search for the information you requested and that is detailed below.

Question

Is it your policy to send x4 Paramedics, or X2 crews (Para Technician, or other) to Cardiac arrest calls?

Answer

NIAS Policy to send x4 responders, which must include a x1 Paramedic.

Question 2

Are there any instances over the last 12 months whereby you have sent x1 crew to a cardiac arrest?

Answer 2

In the unfortunate position when a patient is deemed beyond help/resuscitation by the triage system, we will send x1 resource to these cardiac arrest patients to confirm death and make the appropriate referrals.

I hope the above fully assists you.
