Thank you for your request for information received on 17 November 2015 and which was dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. We would also inform you that Northern Ireland Ambulance Service (NIAS) Health and Social Care Trust has now completed its search for the information you requested and which is detailed below and attached for your attention.

**Question 1**

A record of call-outs for your ambulance service due to sleep-walking during the calendar years 2013, 2014 and 2015 to date including:

- (a) The date (DD/MM/YYYY) of the call-out
- (b) The division/desk area/neighbourhood of the call
- (c) The outcome

**Answer 1**

As previously advised, sleep-walking is not a chief complaint. We therefore checked a free-text field known as what's the problem/reason for call which is completed with further information recorded. For the period identified we searched for the word sleep-walking in the free-text field and identified the following.

I hope the above fully assists you. If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. You should do this as soon as possible, or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter. If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you remain dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request, you may make a complaint under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the Trust has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act.
